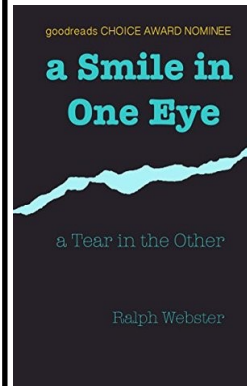
DEVICE ADVICE

All supplies are provided. Kids are welcome with an adult. Free and open to the public.

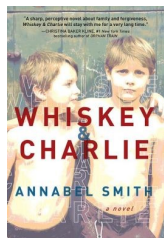


LEARNING EXPRESS ASSISTED COMPUTER CLASSES

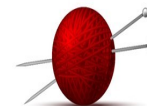
